Drive out to historic Mangowine where we can arrange Devonshire teas combined with an absorbing guided tour of the pioneer homestead. Open Mon, Tues, Thurs, Fri 1.00 to 4.00pm; Sat and Sun 10.00am to 4.00pm. Tel: (08) 9046 5149.

Stroll down to the museum, where you will be enthralled by Bill's stories about the vital role that Nungarin played in the defence of Australia during WWII. The Heritage Army Museum is located in an original army warehouse and shows off a rich collection of army equipment and pioneer artifacts. Open 9.00am to 12.00 noon and 2.00 to 5.00pm each day. Take a leisurely **wander** on one of our self-guided heritage walks. Explore the town and local cemetery and revel in our local stories.

Explore the district on a scripted self-drive tour, and why not include a picnic lunch and scramble over the awesome granite rocks at Talgomine or Eaglestone. Don't forget your camera, the wildflowers in Spring are simply breathtaking.

We would love to **share** all these stories with you.

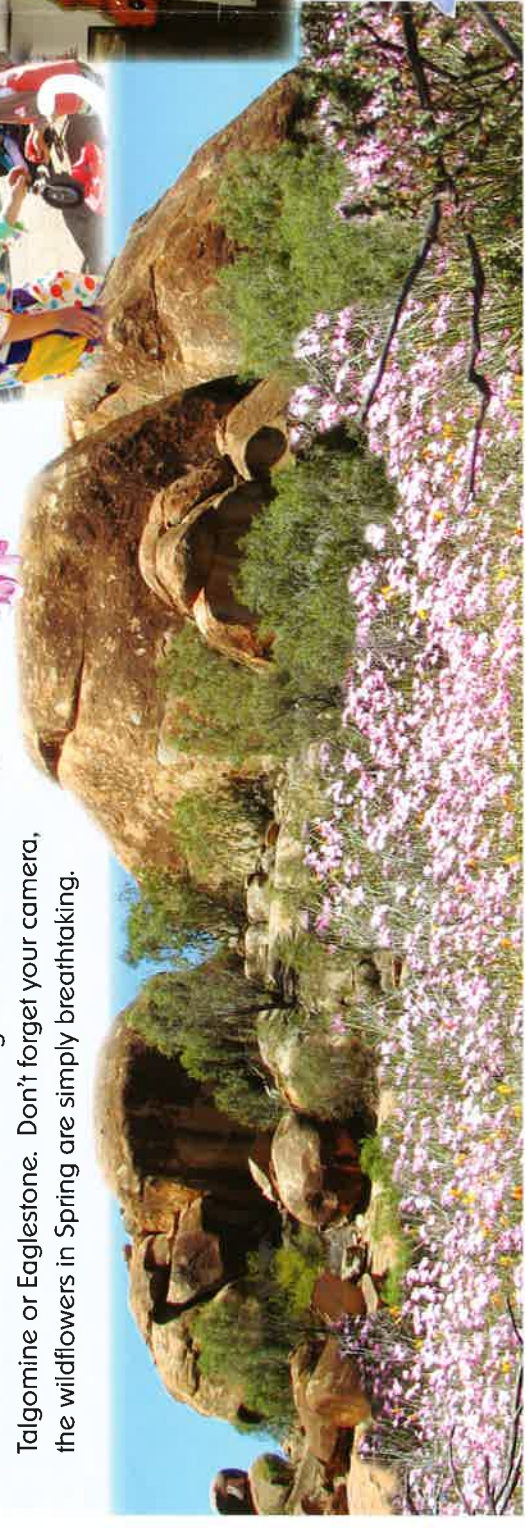

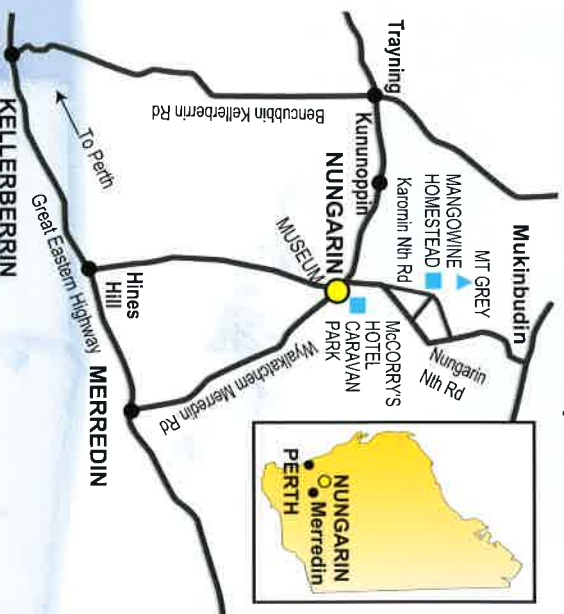
