
A little further out, 5km west on the Brookton Highway, is the iconic Corrigin Dog Cemetery and across the road, the entrance to the Corrigin Wildflower Drive. There's a vast array of beautiful and unusual wildflowers, shrubs and trees throughout the year. There are hundreds of different plants, including Feather Flowers, Leschenaultias, Grevilleas, Mallees, Smoke Bushes and tall Eucalypts which give a fantastic range of colours. Spring flowering orchids include; Donkeys, Cowslips, Mantis, Blue Beard, Spiders, Shells, Snails and Greenhoods. Search for orchids and flowers in the topsoil, under leaf litter.

Corrigin Dog Cemetery

Established in 1974 as a tribute to "Man's Best Friend" the cemetery is unique to Corrigin and is landmarked by a statue of a large dog. Take time to read some of the headstones of beloved pets in their final resting place.

Wildflowers

If you happen to be in Corrigin during the months of September and October, the Wildflower Drive is a must see. There is a vast array of beautiful and unusual wildflowers, shrubs and trees to be found in the area.

Scenic Lookouts

Experience the perfect sunrise or sunset with panoramic views of the town and farmlands. Take a walk up Corrigin Rock, visit the ANZAC Memorial Lookout in town or drive out to the Scenic Lookout along the Wildflower Drive.

Gorge Rock

Located 20km east of town, Gorge Rock is a natural rock pool. Once the local swimming hole, before the Olympic pool was constructed in town, read about its past and enjoy a walk to the top for spectacular panoramic views of the Corrigin countryside.

Take your pick from Adventure Playground, Miss B's or Rotary Park to enjoy a picnic and let the kids have some fun. Each park is a short walk from the town centre, with seating, BBQ's and toilet facilities.


Corrigin Pioneer Museum
