An ode to community members who lived to be 100, and to family farms in operation for over 100 years.

Quairading Vintage Club 2

It's all about camaraderie and assembling or restoring old stuff down at the Vintage Club. Cars, trucks, tractors, motors – you name it – they fix it! Vintage Club members meet for coffee and a chat most mornings about 9am, though if there's a car in the carpark, you're welcome to pop in!

Quairading Museum 3

Located in and around our almost 100-year-old Railway Station you'll be delighted and amazed at the displays of memorabilia, wood sculptures, local historical items - and so many stories.

Quairading War Memorial & Lone Pine 4

The area features many info boards, impressive metal art cut outs and The Lone Pine, a descendant of one of the last pines at The Nek, Gallipoli.

Anglican Church Labyrinth 5

As you walk the labyrinth, its geometric symmetry causes you to develop a rhythm. This helps to still the mind and allows you to let the rest of the world fade away. The idea is to become mentally lost in the labyrinth, resulting in a sense of peace. The labyrinth was built by St Faith's parishioners for community use and you are welcome to walk the labyrinth at any time.

Old School Site 6

As a result of the heritage listed building burning down in 2016 this site now houses interpretive signage, a memorial plaque, seating and a garden, creating an inviting space. A feature at the Old State School Site is the sharing of the John Kickett Story. John was an Aboriginal man who advocated for the right for his children, and future generations, to access education.

Nookaminnie Rock Nature Reserve (5km W) 7

527 hectares of unique remnant vegetation where you can enjoy some of the most beautiful wildflowers the Wheatbelt has to offer. At the heart of the reserve you will find Nookaminnie Rock, a large granite outcrop with magnificent views, a perfect platform to watch our breathtaking sunsets.

Toapin Weir (8km NW) 8

Climb to the top of the rock and take in the picturesque views of the region. Toilet facilities, electric BBQ, shade and info boards can all be found in the carpark. Spotless and quiet (free) overnight camping spot with immaculate skies for pristine star gazing.

Lake Mears (32km SW) 9

This little known local gem is located partly within the Lake Mears Nature Reserve. Well worth a look especially after heavy rainfall to see it in all its glory at full capacity. There are no rubbish facilities here so please leave no trace and take your waste with you.

South Caroling Hall (25km SW) 10

Since 1924 it has functioned continuously as a community and social venue for the people of the area. Dances were a regular event at the hall, as were socials, concerts and family celebrations. The hall still hosts regular summer tennis with social BBQs and is available for hire.

Rabbit Proof Fence & Stacey Lamb Train Gazebo (20km S) 11

One of the longest fences in the world; 3237km! You can view two recreated examples of this historic feat as well as some other local historic information (including the Stacey Lamb Train) in a well-maintained gazebo approximately 20 min drive south of town on the Corrigin Road.

Wamenusking Sports Club (30km S) 12

In its time it has included a cricket team, a tennis club and in recent years an archery club. There's a crew at 'Wammo' playing tennis and archery most Sundays over the warmer months. Self-contained caravanners and campers welcome.

Pink Lake (11km E) 13

Pink Lake is regarded as a local phenomena. It is located 11km east of town on the Bruce Rock road and at certain times of the year the left side of the lake is a distinctive pink colour while the right side remains blue. Summer evaporation causes the water level to drop and salt builds up on the old trees and fence posts. When the water returns, the salt causes the pink colour.

Kwoylin Bush Camp (37km E) 14

Park your caravan in a dedicated bay in this pristine bush camp. The camp boasts toilets, camp kitchen, shelters, dedicated tent camping and caravan bays, campfires with BBQ plate (April to September only), bush walks and a pioneer walk trail through the old campsite & more.

Kokerbin Rock (40km N) 15

Reputed to be the third largest monolith in Australia, Kokerbin Rock looms 122m high and is contained in the 9 hectares that is the Kokerbin Nature Reserve. Unspoilt natural surroundings, unique formations, caves and a view from the top not to be missed combined with picnic, BBQ and toilet facilities help make it a great active family day trip destination.

Mt Stirling (24km NE) 16

Climbing this giant granite outcrop is a great adventure for the fit and agile. The panoramic view from the summit makes the effort worthwhile. The rock is surrounded by wildlife sanctuaries containing the only known mainland population of brush tailed rock wallabies. Keep an eye out for these timid marsupials.
